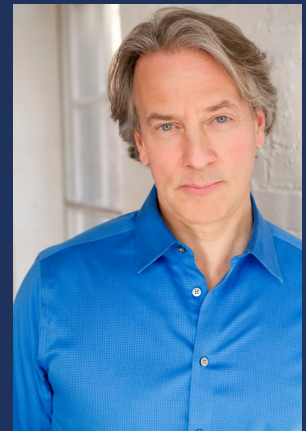

His work has won awards from the Associated Press, Society of Professional Journalists, National Press Photographers Association, The Livingston Awards and The National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences.

As the years went on, he began to notice that the media shifted more from a medium to a production. After years of pursuing journalism, he felt a change of heart regarding what he wanted to pursue. He asked himself the question that we can all be afraid to ask: **Am I experiencing a fulfilling career or simply going through the motions?**

In today's uncertain world, Shimell has advice for career changes and adapting to unpredictable times. He advises about taking risks, and how life is far too short to only take a few. He also speaks on chasing joy in your work, and how when situations evolve, you must continue to search for what makes you happy.
